WORSHIP

“Forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us.” Luke 11:4 (NRSV)

Forgiveness is at the very heart of our Christian faith. That we believe in a God of love whose grace is so bountiful that each one of us might be forgiven our sins. Forgiveness is bought at the highest price – the suffering and death of Jesus Christ. Only he was worthy enough to bear the punishment and gain for us reconciliation with God the Father. God not only calls us, guides and comforts us but he bears the price of our obstinacy in not coming into a loving relationship with him.

To forgive and to be forgiven are at the heart of our healing and wholeness. As we are forgiven for whatever misdemeanour we have committed, we feel better - often a great weight has been lifted from our shoulders. God, himself, in his love for us offers forgiveness to us. No amount of good living or good deeds can earn God’s forgiveness for the wrongdoings of our lives and our separation from him. The gift is his and is complete – he does not hold any record of our wrongs; this is the depth of his love. We only need to acknowledge our need of forgiveness, a cry from our hearts, a genuine desire to be free of guilt and the Lord pours his love in. Forgiven we can stand tall again and go on our way rejoicing – that does not mean that in human terms we can avoid the consequences of our sin. If we are serving a prison sentence for murder or robbery or any other crime, we will have to complete that sentence BUT even in prison we can know that wonderful peace and joy that comes with being forgiven by God.

Being forgiven by someone else for less weighty misdemeanours can have the same result, both for the forgiver and for the forgiven. That same joy and relief liberates our lives. However, being forgiven calls us to be forgivers ourselves. The love we receive should so begin to transform our hearts and lives that are able to forgive others. Being unable to forgive someone is like a festering sore, it continues to grow and turn us bad – we may be angry, resentful, we may come to hate that other person – none of us can move forward in that state. We need a sore to be cleaned out to be healed, so in our own lives we need to be made clean. If our own sores are left to fester not only is any relationship with the person we need to forgive destroyed but also our relationships with those whom we love may be badly affected. A bad apple spreads its badness, an untreated wound can spread and do untold damage. Likewise, our inability to forgive and move on can have the same affect on our lives. It may not be easy and may take prayer and working on to achieve but once achieved we are set free to be the person we are meant to be.

There is no cheap grace with God. If we have received complete forgiveness, so we need to be able to forgive. We may need to front up to our pride, our embarrassment, our hatred, our resentment, our anger, and our deep hurt but through prayer and God’s grace we can achieve it eventually and live again in freedom.

Our God is the one who heals body, mind and spirit – his grace and mercy displayed through his forgiveness and ours of others can touch all those areas. This month is the festival of St Luke, doctor and painter of word pictures which display our Lord as reaching out to the poor, the sick and the marginalised. A good month to think afresh about the healing properties of forgiveness. God Bless Susan

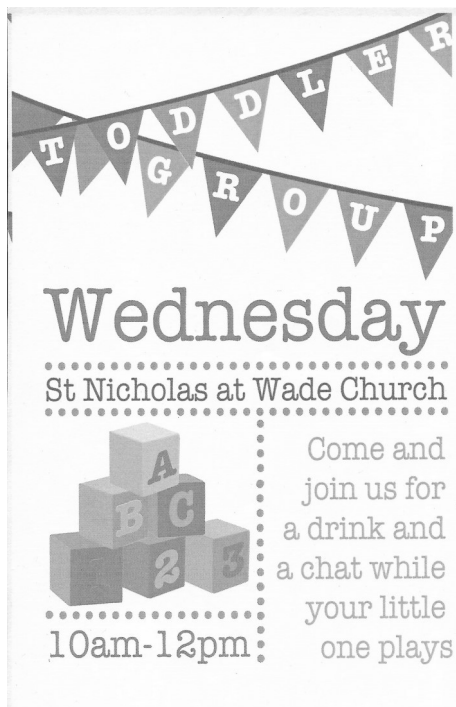

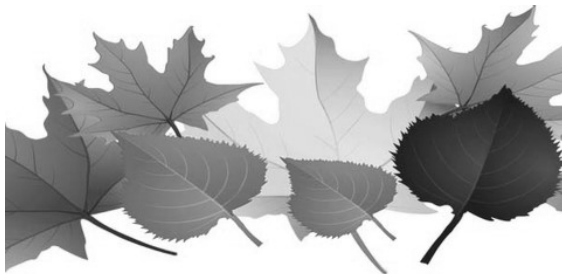

News from St Saviours Church of England School A new academic year has begun at St. Saviour's with ninety-six new Year 3 children joining our school. Our youngest children have settled extremely quickly and are gaining confidence by the day. I have been very heartened by the way our older children treat our newest pupils. Respect is one of our core Christian values and I see it being enacted on a daily basis in classrooms, corridors and on the playground.

An interesting juxtaposition struck me this week. Our youngest pupils have been impressing us all through simple acts of kindness and respect. Staff report having doors held open for adults and other children by Year 3 pupils; these children have learned from the example set by older St. Saviour's pupils. I spent some time in a Year 3 classroom today and witnessed a young man offering to work with a child who was not behaving well. This helpful pupil showed great kindness and patience by including the other child in a paired counting activity, in an effort to keep him on task and out of trouble. The good natured cajoling worked beautifully and the child improved his behaviour.

However, while watching the news last night, I witnessed politicians on both sides of the spectrum shouting at and insulting each other. Political differences in opinion had boiled over into open hostility. If we saw this behaviour on a street corner or playground, we would deplore 'the youth of today'. Our children make me more hopeful than some of our politicians. At St. Saviour's we teach children that you can disagree with someone without hating them. Words like 'traitor', 'sabotage', 'fascist' and 'surrender' have been hurled around by our political class recently; I wonder what example is being set for young people.

We all lose our temper occasionally; a polarising issue can make us all angry because we care. I was inspired by the words of the husband of murdered M.P Jo Cox on Radio 4 this morning when he said (to paraphrase) 'there is more that unites us than divides us'. I must remember to feed this line into collective worship for children. Schools are full of disagreement; argument can be healthy and we all need to be resilient to having our views challenged. In my view, it is the job of teachers, adults and leaders at all levels to set the tone. If we expect children to respect difference, to put their point across with respect and to use logic rather than vitriol, we must endeavour to do the same. At St. Saviour's, what unites us is a desire to see children flourish and become happy healthy and skilled members of our community; as a staff team, this is our common goal.

The respect and care shown by all St. Saviour's children, families, governors, clergy and staff over the last three weeks gives me hope that Christian and British values are alive and well – in Westgate at least!

From the Parochial Church Council Minutes (PCC).....

Meeting 24/07/19.

Minutes approved 18/09/19 without amendment

Matters arising. Follow up to item in minutes of 26 June 2019. Shop canopies. It was agreed no further action was required by the PCC. Donation for new mugs. A thank you card from the PCC had been now been sent to the donor.

Worship and Mission. Food Bank. A report of a visit to Storehouse was received along with examples of referral forms and other papers. It was unanimously agreed to change support from the Thanet Food Link to Storehouse from 1 August 2019. Thanks to Ann Lawrence for taking the donated foods to the Thanet Food Link were recorded. Suitable narrow trolley to replace existing collection box to be obtained. Review of Church Birthday celebrations. Afternoon events considered worthwhile with a steady stream of people visiting the building and grounds. Free refreshments and the garden games were enjoyed. The afternoon was intended to show the parish church was part of the community rather than fundraising, but £79.84 had been raised with a further £40.31 donated at the Songs of Praise. Members of St Saviour's School choir attended along with members of local churches and the community. Thanks were recorded to the Birchington Handbell Ringers, local bell-ringers, the United Services Club for the loan of stocks and Revd Andrew Way for his help with the PA system. Choir robes. Now in use and admired. Holy Baptism. Orders of service used by St Nicholas-at-Wade have been used but intend St Saviours' to have own booklets. Proposal to use a nave altar for family communions in November and December.

Treasurer's report. Copies of all transactions for June 2019 along with a written report had been previously sent to all members. There was much discussion related to reconciling the bank statements with Heritage Lottery Funding (HLF) as none of the papers previously requested had been circulated. Mrs Carter maintained that the payments from HLF were net of VAT and therefore claims made under the Listed Places of Worship Grant scheme (LPOWGs) had been made correctly. Evidence was requested to enable a further claim to be made. The apparently excessive sum in the PCC HLF account was queried. An email from the HLF stating that they were satisfied the correct grant payment had been paid was circulated. Discussion brought to a close with further questions to be brought to the next meeting.

Churchwarden's report. The offer by a member of the congregation to fund half the cost of upgrading the toilet had been retracted. Since the estimate of £2000 had been obtained, the need for a baby changing area had been identified. Members were asked to create a wish list for works to be funded by the money held on deposit.

Correspondence. Licence to photocopy. Details of a new licence enabling photocopying of non-music books, study-guides and children's activity books were provided. It was agreed there was no need for such copying at present. Website audit. Results to be discussed with churchwardens.

Any Other Business. Autumn Fair to be held on Saturday 16 November between 10am – 12 noon. Following recent resignations the Social Activity Group has three new members. The offer by Mr and Mrs Clark to explore the possibility of an organ recital by David Flood (organist at Canterbury Cathedral) was welcomed. The event would be in aid of raising funds towards cleaning the East window. Thanks were extended to Mrs Staziker for her fresh flower arrangements. The PCC was in favour of members of the congregation providing and arranging their own flowers for occasions that were special to them. Attention was drawn to the Deanery Synod event on 28 September 2019 at Holy Trinity Margate. Further details to be provided. The display of folders by the Westgate Heritage Centre (WHC) along the west wall, made cleaning difficult. A volunteer from the WHC had offered to do the necessary cleaning so the PCC authorised the folders being left on permanent display.

Now I have reached my 8th decade and am now "a little old lady" I have been looking back on my memories and thought I would share a happy one with you. It was 1977 and Alan had been posted to Sierra Leone in West Africa. The Queen had just celebrated her Silver Jubilee and the Royal Navy had held a Spithead Review, after which the ships were sent to the Commonwealth countries for Naval visits. We had a Destroyer, a Nuclear Submarine and a Fleet Auxiliary boat in Free-town. From the Destroyer, The Newcastle, we received a message that they would like to have a children's party on the day of arrival for 25 children. We asked if it could be 30 and they agreed. We invited 10 blind, 10 deaf and 10 orphaned children. As transport was a problem colleagues with cars were organised to bring them to the boat. I was able to tell the sailors which children were in which cars. It was really lovely to see how those men behaved; they were dressed up as pirates, and for the orphans they hid and jumped out on them, the deaf they made faces at as they came up the gangplank, and the blind were greeted at the bottom and led up. The children were given a tour of the boat and they were lifted up to sit on the guns and other equipment including the big "Steering Wheel" on The Bridge. They then had tea and played pass the parcel, (everyone seemed to get a present) after which they had cartoons in the rest room. An alternative game had been chosen for the blind children but they wanted to "see" the cartoons. After two and a half hours the cars came back to pick up some extremely happy and tired children.

Westgate-on-Sea Heritage Centre

The Heritage Centre started its commemorations for the **80th anniversary of the Second World War** on **Saturday 7th September**, when more than 100 people came along to hear members of the Heritage Centre read a script I had prepared called **"The Day War Broke Out"**. We received many compliments, as I think that people appreciated being able to hear authentic voices - mostly local - from the past, telling their very moving stories. The twelve cast members deserve thanks and admiration. They had no rehearsals and some had only received their scripts a couple of days before. I wasn't feeling at my best on the Saturday morning, so simply handed them a piece of paper with the order in which the pieces were to be read and the instruction to find a seat and make sure they had access to a microphone!

It was followed up on **21st September**, when the Heritage Centre supported **National Heritage Open Day** by members being at the function room in the Town Hall Buildings from 12 noon to 4.00 p.m. and taking part in the reading of a short script called **"Westgate and the Phoney War"** (September 1939-April 1940). I wasn't able to be present, but I heard good reports and again, I personally thank all who helped in any way that day or on the Friday in the preparations. Apparently some people had not come because of the difficult access for the not very mobile and, of course, it was not part of our usual programme. We will probably repeat it early in the New Year with some additional material at one of our usual Saturday morning meetings.

2020 will be important because we have both the evacuation of the Thanet children in June 1940 and the lead up to the Battle of Britain to commemorate. These were significant events in the history of Thanet and we do have a large number of wonderful stories. I feel strongly that we owe it to those who came forward over the past fifteen years to tell their stories and, even, if I cannot do so myself, I am confident that other members will be willing and able to do so.

Our October talk will have some links with Westgate and the Second World War. It is a power point presentation on **"Westgate, a place for schools"** and will explain what led a government official to give that verdict in 1934 - in other words it will be "potted" history of the private boarding schools that played so important a part in Westgate life for more than a century and the effect of their leaving the town in September 1939. Almost all did not return after the war and the town was never the same again. Do come along! You will be welcome.

Our **bespoke bench** is now ready and will soon be delivered to TDC to install at St Mildred's Bay before Remembrance Sunday. Watch out for notices and information on social media.

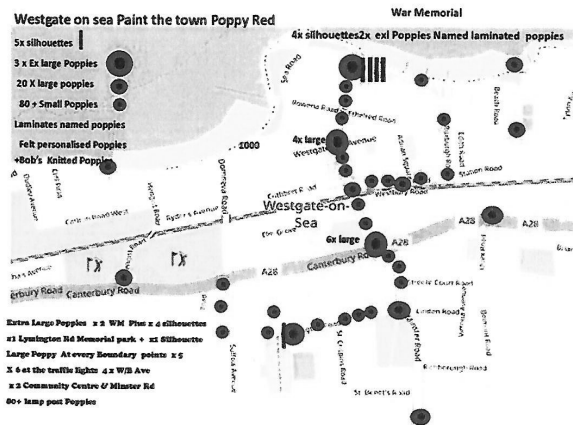

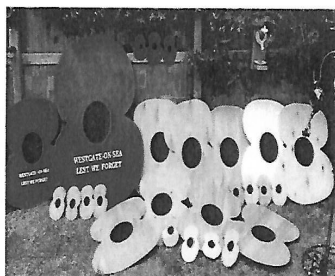
