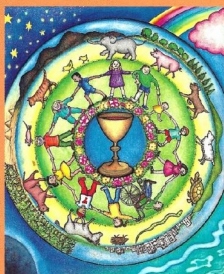

Dear friends,

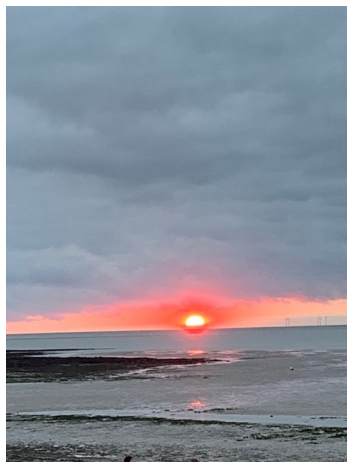

ROMANTIC OR SINISTER?

DIFFERENT PERSPECTIVES ON VAUGHAN WILLIAMS' "THE LARK ASCENDING"

"The Lark Ascending", by Ralph Vaughan Williams, has been voted the UK's favourite piece of classical music. But this piece is overshadowed by impending war, and was written in Margate as the British Navy prepared for battle. On 5th September the original score for violin and piano will be performed by Jack Liebeck (violin) and Daniel Grimwood (piano) in St Saviour's Church in Westgate on Sea. The programme also includes the Violin Sonata by Cesar Franck, which Jack will be performing at the Leeds Festival.

Ralph Vaughan Williams, was born in a Gloucester village on 2nd October 1872, the third child of the local vicar. Next year will be the 150th anniversary of this man who did so much to record English folk music and revive an interest in mediaeval English music.

In various polls to vote for the UK's favourite piece of classical music, his composition "The Lark Ascending" has been at number one, most recently with over 200,000 votes in the Classic FM Hall of Fame. Seen as an idyllic sound-picture of beautiful natural surroundings and the sweetness of birdsong, based on a poem by George Meredith, this extended single-movement violin piece clearly has a special place in the public affection, along with another of Vaughan Williams' single-movement works "Variations on a theme of Thomas Tallis", another romantic piece based on mediaeval English themes.

But the beginnings of this composition throw a very different perspective on it, since it was born under the shadow of war.

We can trace the beginnings of "The Lark Ascending" to 1914, and we know that he spent a week's holiday in Margate that year, during which he worked on the composition. As he looked out into the Channel he would have seen the Navy ships in exercises preparing for the war that was to follow. During the war, he was a stretcher-bearer carrying the wounded from the front. After the war he produced – on the basis of the score for violin and piano - an orchestrated version which is the one we know today; it was given its first performance in 1920.

The score for violin and piano is rarely heard these days, but on 5th September at 3pm it will be performed in St Saviours Church, Westgate on Sea, by Jack Liebeck (violin) and Daniel Grimwood (piano).

Did you know that the UK's favourite piece of classical music, "The Lark Ascending" by Ralph Vaughan Williams, was composed in Margate just as war broke out in 1914?

We can trace the beginnings of "The Lark Ascending" to 1914, and we know that Vaughan Williams spent a holiday in Margate that year, during which he worked on the composition. As he looked out into the Channel he would have seen the Royal Navy ships in exercises preparing for the war that was to follow. During the war, he was a stretcher-bearer, carrying the wounded from the front. After the war he produced, on the basis of the original score for violin and piano, an orchestral version which is the one we know today; it was given its first performance in 1920.

The score for violin and piano is rarely heard these days, but on 5th September at 3pm, it will be performed in St Saviours Church, Westgate on Sea, by Jack Liebeck (violin) and Daniel Grimwood (piano), along with the Violin Sonata of Cesar Franck.

In the 25 years since his debut with the Halle, Jack has worked with many international conductors and orchestras. Jack's latest album, the Schoenberg and Brahms violin concertos with the BBC Symphony Orchestra, was released in March 2020 on Orchid Classics as part of his 40th birthday celebrations.

Daniel's interest in music started as a 3-year-old in Kent, playing next door's piano. At the age of 7 he was already giving public performances. He is especially interested in early piano music and his recordings of Liszt and Chopin, performed on an 1851 Erard piano, received a unanimous chorus of praise from the press.

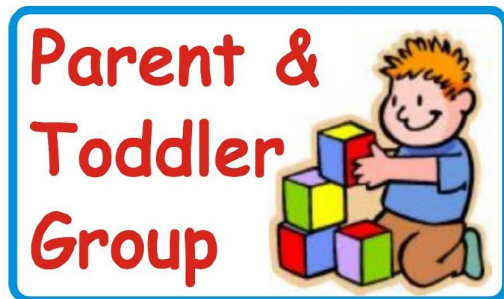

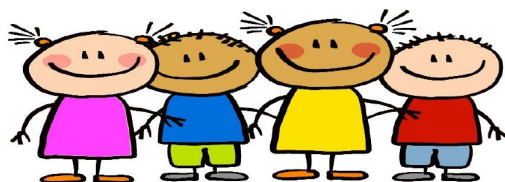

St Saviour's Church Heating Project (update 2)

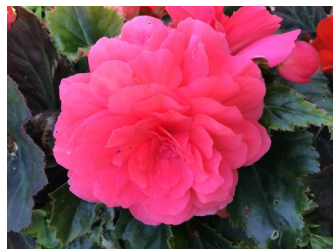
In the last article (May magazine), we were awaiting a visit from members of the DAC, Archdeacon Jo Kelly-Moore and our architect due to take place on 12 May. We put forward our proposals for heating the side aisles, nave and chancel at this meeting advising that we were considering one of two companies. One provided heaters similar to those already installed (Herschell) and the other panel heaters set in the roof space (Solray). Archdeacon Jo, together with Edmund Harris (Care of Churches Officer) for the diocese, considered that heaters placed at high level in the nave were intrusive. Equally, heaters on the chancel walls were inappropriate. Our architect suggested that heating panels could be sited within the side aisle roof space and heating in the chancel provided by under pew heaters and skirting heaters in the sanctuary. The revised particulars were conveyed to the heating firms which effectively narrowed our option to the one company providing heating panels (Solray). However, they were unable to provide the alternative heating for the chancel/sanctuary. This is now being explored with a couple of other heating companies. Initial discussions suggest it may cost around £5000 for the chancel/sanctuary.

On 23 August 2021, the PCC met to decide whether to accept the quotation for the supply and fit of 24 heaters (12 each side) in the roof space of the side aisles. Six heaters will serve the side aisle from the chancel to the west wall and a further six heaters in a higher row will serve the nave, again from the chancel to the west wall. Cost in round figures is £36000 which was approved by the PCC, and Solray asked to proceed with creating drawings and specifications for the work. We also have to engage a firm of electricians to provide the wiring from the mains to the heaters. Estimates are currently being sought from a couple of electrical companies.

Once all the necessary documents have been provided, an application for a Faculty will be forwarded to the Diocese for the heating of the nave and side aisles. Provided the application is approved, there follows a period of one month during which a public notice of the proposed works has to be displayed. When the period of notice is completed the Faculty may be granted and works can then proceed. The PCC remain hopeful that works will be completed before the end of the year. The heating of the chancel/sanctuary may be the subject of a separate faculty application.



Picture giving a rough idea of where heaters will be positioned (detailed plans have yet to be drafted). The lower run will be continuous and is designed to heat objects (people) in the side aisle. There will be six heaters in a second row (not all shown) positioned in the roof space to provide heat projected through the gap between the stone pillars to the nave area. Again designed to heat objects (people). The heaters will be, as far as is possible, colour matched to the rafters.

Bells from your Verger

For anyone who missed Mother Karen's introduction recently at Sunday Service, I am Steve the new Verger at St Saviour's. On Sunday's you'll find me sitting next to Aidan helping with the weekly Livestream Service and operating the CD player for our hymns.

I would like to say thank you to everyone who has welcomed me to St Saviour's and to those who have offered me guidance and support in my new role as Verger. I will be working with Stuart who has been your Verger for many years and has lots of knowledge on the subject and has been an excellent mentor to me.

I started school at Holy Trinity School in Margate, (opposite the Winter Gardens in Trinity Square - now a housing development) but after a year mum and dad heard of a new school being built and once open, I was transferred to the Cliftonville Primary School in Northumberland Ave. From there I was accepted at Hartsdown Secondary School and I was in the first group of pupils to be offered the opportunity to join their "new" Sixth Form as before then, you were expected to leave school for employment.

After failing my Geography O'level 3 times, I left school with a few qualifications in the subjects I had enjoyed and joined BT (this was at the time when the Busby TV adverts were popular, narrated by Bernard Cribbins). 35 years later, I'm still there and these days I'm responsible for planning new corporate fibre optics in East Anglia.

After about 10 years digging spuds at my allotment in Lymington Road, I decided to hang up my spade and for 6 months I was looking for something to do. Having received copies of The Link, I wandered along to St Saviour's bell tower one Thursday evening and asked Dorothe and Stuart if I could have a go at ringing.

Bell Ringing is an excellent hobby from ages 6 to 90 (yes ninety!) and it gets both the mind and body moving. My lower back pain caused by digging and weeding at my allotment was certainly eased once I began to ring each week. However trying to get mind, body and soul relaxed and working in unison whilst holding a rope with a very large bell just above your head is an art I think I should have started much earlier in life. On occasions my performance is below par and something you hope the nearby neighbours of St Saviour's are not listening to. Our bell ringing band are a friendly group and always supportive, even when I crunch my bell with another.

If you would like to give it a try, please pop in to one of our Thursday night practices.

I had no comprehension of what a global pandemic was (don't forget I didn't achieve a Geography O'level) or indeed how it would affect my work, or my son staying at university or my wife's simple train ride to work in Broadstairs, which was now anything but simple! However a blessing in disguise was I had time on my hands and when I contacted Church Warden Christine, before I knew it, I was the new Saturday Morning Helper.

So from occasional attendee, to Bell Ringer, to St Saviour's Shepherd to Verger, I have been helped and supported by you all - Thank you.

I'll finish now with two quick points. I am a member of The Church of England Guild of Vergers and they offer a diploma course which I have asked about and details on how to enrol. It will be approximately 4 years to complete and I'll need lots of help from you all with my homework!

And finally, if you hear me call out "Look to, trebles going...trebles gone" you will know I'm ringing the bells at St Saviour's and I'll apologise in advance for my performance; the minds willing...the bodies willing...but we have yet to master the skill of mind and body agreeing in which direction we are both going to travel.

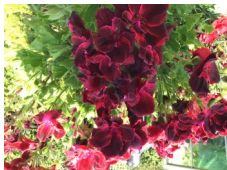

News from St Saviour's Church of England School

A Governor's perspective

Once again the lockdowns brought about by the pandemic has impacted the progress of our pupils over the past year. The return to school last September was met with some concerns, but these were largely unfounded since the children were simply happy to be meeting up with friends once again.

A priority was to establish the gaps in knowledge of every pupil and to plan the strategies needed to be in place. This is an area in which staff excel and interventions were very quickly arranged. It was frustrating that a further lockdown in December should be imposed just at the time when effects of the learning strategies were beginning to show in the progress of pupils. When the school reopened in March, there was some re-evaluation of pupil needs. As there were no SATS again this year there was little meaningful data to be provided to the governors, but the assessment of pupil progress towards the end of the academic year showed some giant strides in recovering the lost months of teaching. One of the unseen knock on effects of the lockdowns, is the need for our school to teach the year 1 and 2 curriculum missed by children whilst attending infant school. Much work and training was undertaken by year 3 staff to recover the position with considerable progress being made. It is a credit to all staff at St Saviours School, and one which the governors are proud of, that their dedication to teaching, long hours and hard work enables our children to learn so successfully. The summer break is a needed and well deserved period in which to recharge batteries, but not forgetting that preparation for the new term has to be completed during this time. It is far from being a long holiday!

Throughout the past year governors have not been able to visit the school and meetings with Mr Bonell and other members of staff have taken place virtually. It was therefore a delight to attend the year 6 graduation at the school. The weather was sunny and warm with many parents present. Every child was presented with a scroll, a class photograph and a bookmark donated by St Saviour's Church. Plus the mandatory photo with Mr Bonell for the parent album. It is hoped that this event can be held once again in St Saviour's Church next year.

Everyone involved in St Saviour's School, including governors, look forward to the return to a school not constrained by areas set aside for year groups in September, and school life can revert to usual routines. It is a sincere hope that the need for lockdowns is past and our children can again enjoy the freedom of an outstanding learning environment.

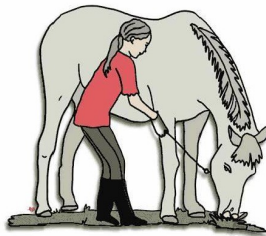

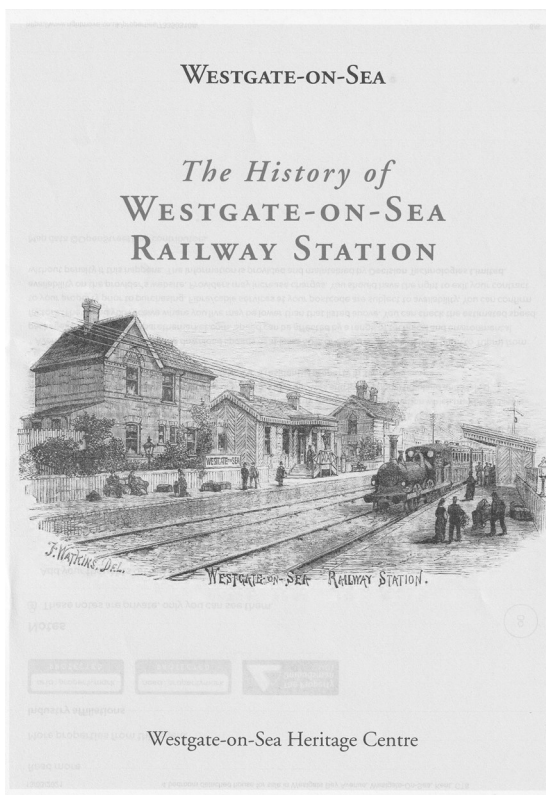
